GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Students have specific Rota duties done every morning.

These include sweeping their classrooms, verandah and surrounding. It is essential to do your 'duty but always look to see if you can do more. Whatever you do, do it with joy, enthusiasm and intelligence. The following is the position of the school:

DISCIPLINE

Students are expected to be self-disciplined.

Where there is a breach of rules, the offender will have to undergo some form of punishment. Punishment is necessary for the following reasons:

I. To correct students.

II. To discourage wrong doing

III. For others to learn that wrong doing will not go unpunished IV. To ensure the maintenance of peace in the school community PHONES

- 1. Possession of mobile phones is NOT permitted during school hours.
- 2. Any student, who wishes to bring a mobile phone to school for any reason, MUST submit the phone at the security desk to be picked up at the close of school.
- 3. No student would be permitted to receive a call during school hours; it is strictly forbidden and same goes to possession of phones during school hours.

PUNCTUALITY: School begins at 7:30 Am. Students are expected to be present in their various classes to commence academic activities. It is a punishable offence to be late or absent from school or class without a good reason.

UNIFORMS: Correct school uniforms are to be worn correctly before resuming at 7:30am and till the close of day at 4:00pm.

Uniforms will be worn for educational visits including exit permits. ABSENCE: No student should absent his/her self from organized school activity unless he/she has an excuse note from the school or the clinic.
